



FREE SCHOOL MEALS

OFFERED AT ALL CCISD ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS
FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

Breakfast and lunch meals will be free to all elementary students
(regardless of meal eligibility) and children in the community (18 & under)
starting **Monday, October 19th.**

Each child will be able to receive one breakfast meal
and one lunch meal per day at no cost.



- **Brick & Mortar Elementary Students:** Free meals will be available to all brick and mortar elementary students in the school cafeteria serving line.
- **Clear Connections Elementary Students:** Free curbside meals will be available for pick-up to all virtual elementary students. Meals should continue to be pre-ordered on SchoolCafè and picked up at the student's campus during school meal times.
- **All Children 18 & Under:** Free meals will be available to children 18 and under, including all CCISD secondary students, for curbside pick-up from any CCISD elementary campus. Visit the CCISD Child Nutrition website and click on the "Elementary Curbside Meal Information" link for specific pick-up times at each campus.

***PLEASE NOTE:** While free meals will temporarily be offered to all elementary students, meal benefits applications should be submitted on SchoolCafè as usual. Applications will still be accepted during this time to ensure students receive the proper meal benefits once free meals expires.

*If you have already been approved for free meal benefits for the 20-21 school year, you do not need to reapply.
