

**APPLICATION**

A student enrolled in the District or who participates in an extracurricular activity or a University Interscholastic League (UIL) competition is subject to District policy and UIL rules regarding participation.

**EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY**

An extracurricular activity is an activity sponsored by the UIL, the Board, or an organization approved by the Board. The activity is not necessarily directly related to instruction of the essential knowledge and skills, but may have an indirect relation to some areas of the curriculum. Extracurricular activities include, but are not limited to: public performances, contests, demonstrations, displays, and club activities. In addition, an activity is subject to this regulation if any one of the following criteria apply:

1. The activity is competitive.
2. The activity is held in conjunction with another activity that is considered extracurricular.
3. The activity is held off-campus, except in a case in which adequate facilities do not exist on campus.
4. The general public is invited.
5. An admission is charged.

**EXCEPTION:  
PUBLIC  
PERFORMANCE**

A student ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities, but who is enrolled in a state-approved course that requires demonstration of the mastery of the essential knowledge and skills in a public performance may participate in the performance if:

1. The performance is one to which the general public is invited; and
2. The requirement for student participation in public is stated in the essential knowledge and skills of the course.

PARENTAL NOTICE	A District employee is not required to obtain the consent of a child's parent before an audio or video recording is made of the child or child's voice if the recording is to be used only for a purpose related to a co-curricular or extracurricular activity.
INELIGIBILITY FROM ACTIVITIES	A student shall be ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activity sponsored or sanctioned by the District or the UIL after a grade evaluation period in which the student received a grade lower than the equivalent of 70 on a scale of 100 in any academic class Ineligibility until the next grade evaluation period and the student meets the participation requirements as described below.
GRADE EVALUATION PERIOD	"Grade evaluation period" is defined as the first six weeks of a school year and each grade reporting period thereafter.
SCHOOL WEEK	The school week is defined as beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the first instructional day of the calendar week and ending at the close of instruction on the last instructional day of the calendar week, excluding holidays.
ADVANCED COURSES	<p>The following are considered "advanced courses" for the purposes of this policy:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. English Language Arts: All College Board advanced placement courses (AP and Pre AP) in the discipline and high school/college concurrent enrollment classes (dual credit courses)</li> <li>2. Fine Arts: All College Board advanced placement courses (AP and Pre AP) in the discipline and high school/college concurrent enrollment classes (dual credit courses), Dance IV (not to include dance team activities), Art IV, Music IV, and Theatre IV;</li> <li>3. Languages other than English: All College Board advanced placement courses (AP and Pre AP) and high school/college concurrent enrollment classes (dual credit courses) and languages other than English courses Levels IV-VII;</li> <li>4. Mathematics: All College Board advanced placement courses (AP and Pre AP) and high school/college concurrent enrollment classes (dual credit courses);</li> </ol>

5. Science: All College Board advanced placement courses (AP and Pre AP) and high school/college concurrent enrollment classes (dual credit courses); and
6. Social Studies: Social Studies Advanced Studies, Economics Advanced Studies, all College Board advanced placement courses (AP and Pre AP) and high school/college concurrent enrollment classes (dual credit courses).

All advanced courses that are considered exempt in CCISD are updated annually and posted on the district website. Local school districts may adopt more stringent standards to the advanced course list as stated in the UIL Side by Side document developed by TEA and the UIL.

**STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES**

Ineligibility of a student with a disability that significantly interferes with the student's ability to meet regular academic standards shall be based on the student's failure to meet the requirements of the student's individualized education program, (IEP) as determined by the admission, review, and dismissal (ARD) committee.

**PRACTICE OR REHEARSAL**

A student ineligible under Education Code 33.081 may practice or rehearse with other students for an extracurricular activity but may not participate in a competition or other public performance.

**SUSPENSION LIMIT**

A suspension shall not last beyond the end of a school year.

**REINSTATEMENT**

Until the ineligibility is removed or the school year ends, the District shall review the grades of a student suspended under these provisions at the end of each three-week period following the date on which the suspension began. At the time of a review, and following the seven-day waiting period the ineligibility is removed if the student's grade in each class, is equal to or greater than the equivalent of 70 on a scale of 100.

**LIMIT ON ABSENCES**

The District shall allow a student a maximum of seventeen absences for participation in an extracurricular activity sponsored or sanctioned by the District, UIL, or an organization sanctioned by the Board.
