

Free March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day Frequently Asked Questions

Who will receive this opportunity?

All currently enrolled Juniors are registered for the March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day administration.

I do not want my student taking this assessment, what do I do?

Parents/Guardians who do NOT want their student to participate in the free March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day administration must complete the form at:

This form must be completed before 9:00 AM on January 31, 2020.

Will colleges and universities accept the results from the March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day administration?

Yes, the student results are official. The results are accepted at colleges and universities for admission requirements.

Will students be given the option to have their scores sent to the colleges/universities they are considering?

Yes. Students may request their results be sent to four colleges/universities for free. The college codes will be entered on the student's answer document on the day of the administration. The students will be provided the college codes on March 4, but it is the student's responsibility to know which colleges they wish to send the scores.

Will the March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day administration effect my student's eligibility for final exam exemptions at the end of the year?

No. Student who participate in the March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day administration will be on campus and will not be counted absent.

How do we add the Essay to the March 4, 2020 SAT® School Day administration?

College Board provides two SAT® assessments:

- SAT®
- SAT® Essay

To complete the essay, the student must register for the SAT® with Essay assessment. On March 4, 2020, the students will be administered the SAT® assessment.

What if my student is registered to take the SAT® on March 14, 2020?

Will my student be excused from Dual Credit classes on March 4, 2020 if they participate in the SAT® School Day administration?

Your student must talk with their college professor.
